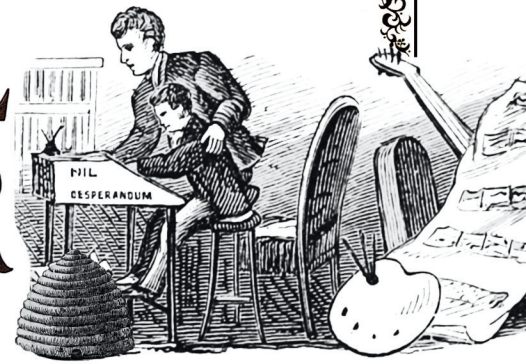

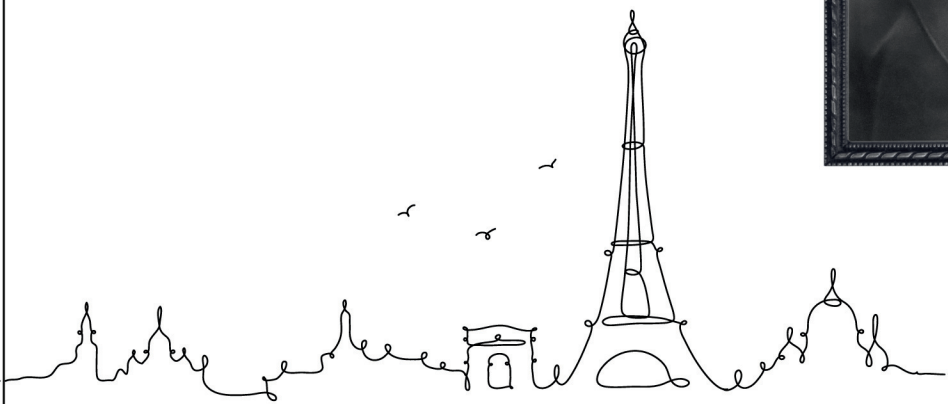
# LEARNING WITH LIGHT

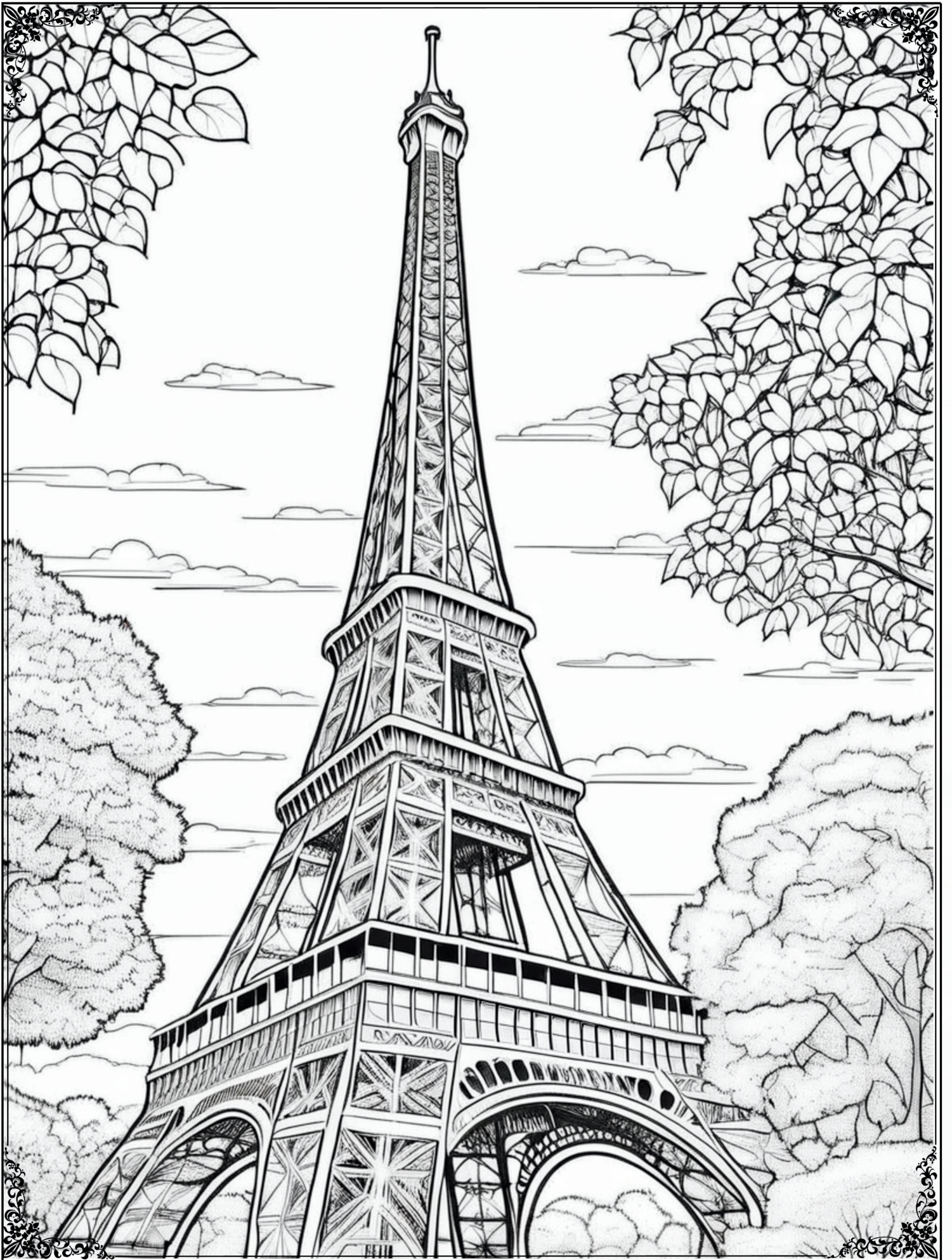

# DISCOVER FRANCE

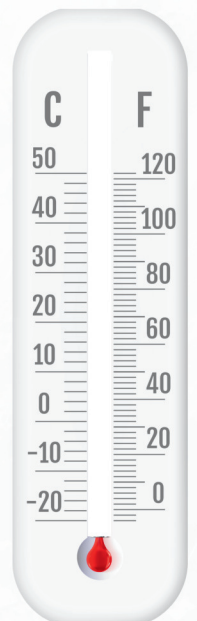
1. Mark where you live on the map. Mark France's location.

## Get Curious! Research and Discover

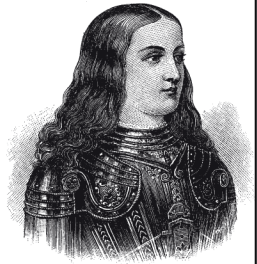


The Eiffel Tower wasn't supposed to stay.

→ Research why Parisians wanted it torn down after the World's Fair in 1889. Write a short persuasive argument either defending it as a masterpiece or calling it an eyesore.

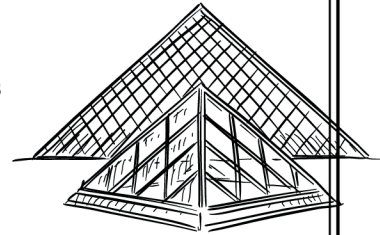
Joan of Arc was only 17 when she led soldiers into battle.

→ Research why architect I. M. Pei designed the modern glass pyramid for such an ancient museum. Write one paragraph defending whether you think it "fits" or not.

→ Research the top speed of the TGV (Train à Grande Vitesse). Then calculate how long it would take to travel from Paris to Lyon (about 290 miles) at that speed.

The metric system began in France.

→ Research why leaders wanted a new way of measuring things. Then measure 5 household objects in both inches and centimeters. Which is easier to use? Why? Create your own conversion problem for a friend to solve.

→ Imagine you got locked inside overnight. Write a short adventure story about exploring the palace. Be descriptive—what do you see, hear, and feel? What kind of adventure do you go on?
