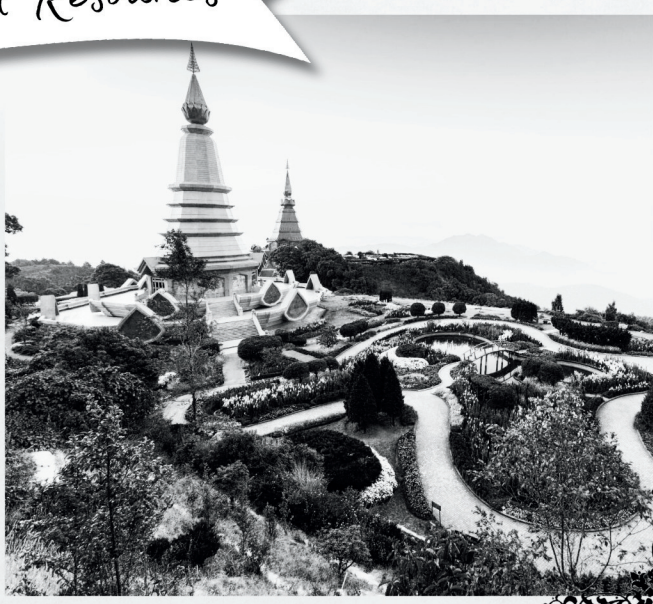

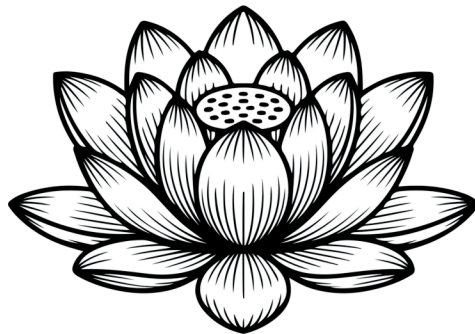


LEARNING WITH LIGHT

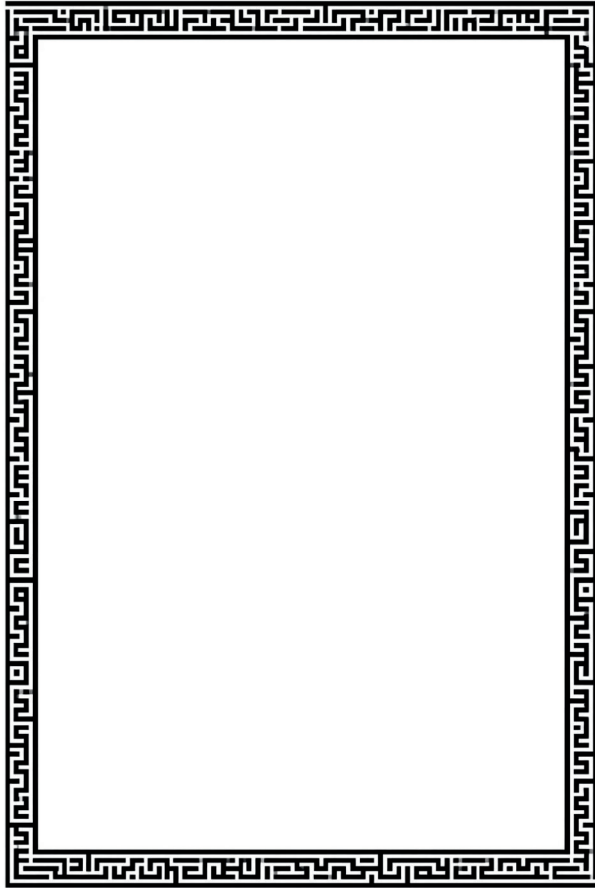

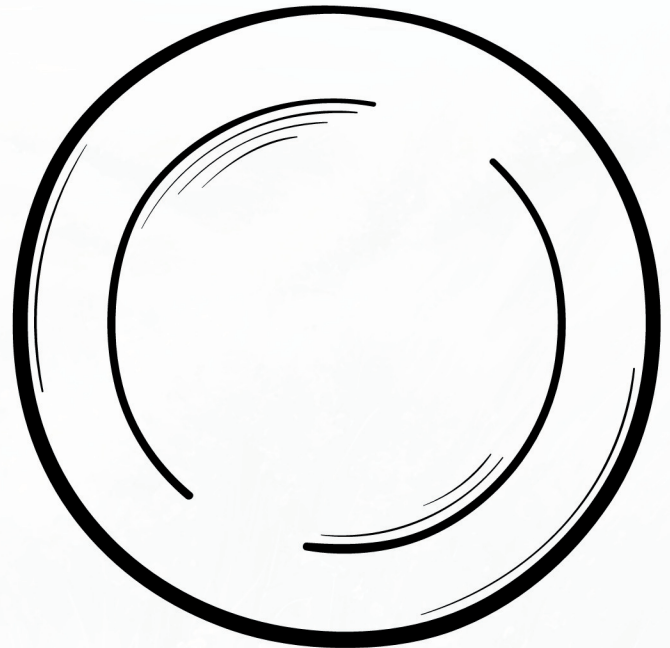

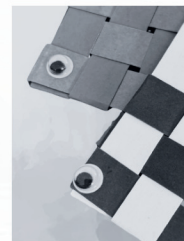

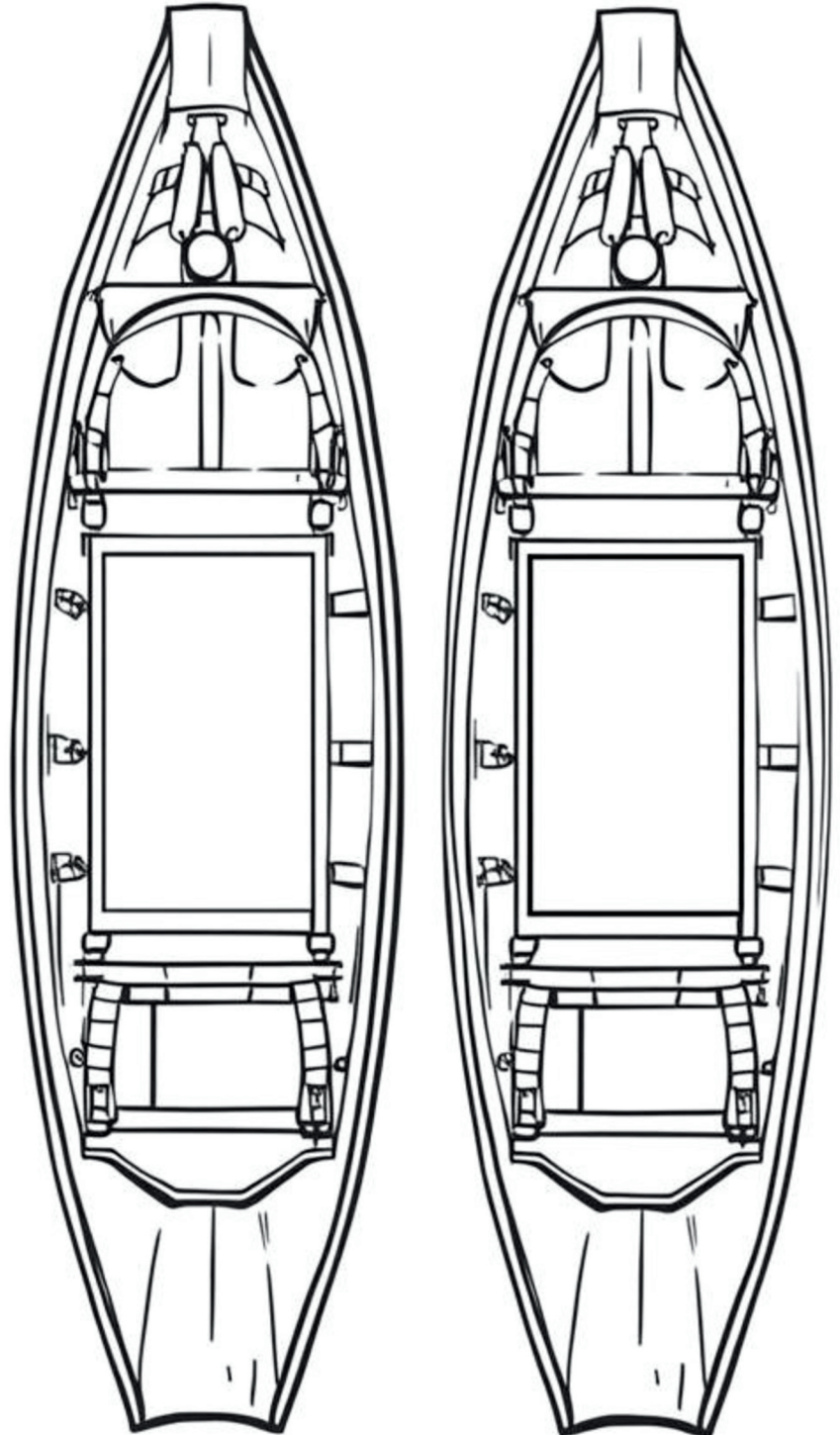
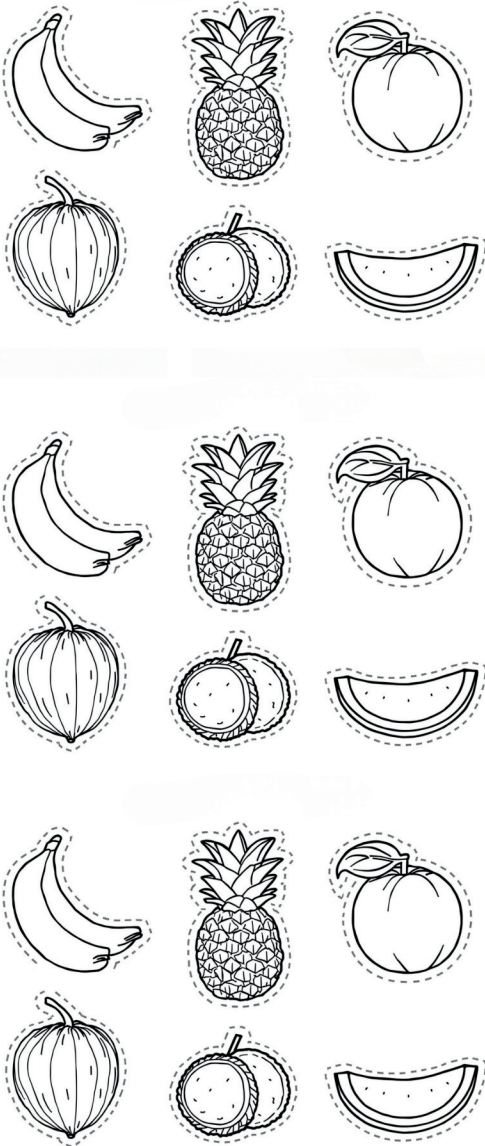
THAILAND ROYAL BARGES

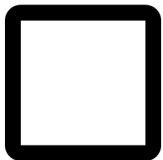
Geometry in Temples: Patterns That Calm the Mind

Thai art and temples are full of repeating patterns—symmetry, triangles, spirals, and geometric borders. Find a photo of a Thai temple roof or design pattern and choose one section to “zoom in” on. How many repeating shapes do you see? Try drawing your own repeating pattern, then discuss with your family why people love patterns—and how order can feel peaceful.



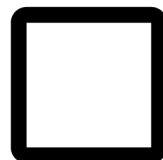
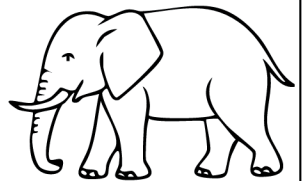
Monsoon Math: How Much Rain Is That?!

Thailand has a monsoon season, which means rain can fall in powerful bursts. Look up the average rainfall in Bangkok during one monsoon month (in millimeters). Convert it to inches, then imagine that much water spread across your driveway or yard—how deep would it be? Write a few lines about what it would feel like to live somewhere where rain shapes daily life.



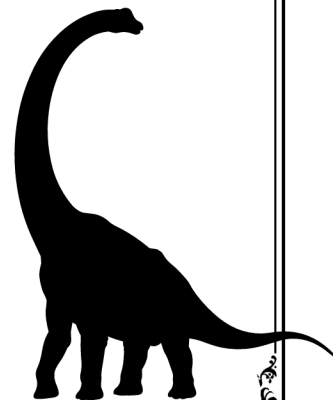
The Elephant Brain

Elephants are known for memory, family bonds, and intelligence. Look up two facts about elephant thinking or communication—one about their brain or memory, and one about how they communicate (sound, vibration, touch, or body language). Now do something deeper: compare elephants to another animal you choose (dolphins, dogs, bees, ravens, etc.). What kind of intelligence does each one seem to have, and why might God design different creatures with different strengths? Journal about it.



Giants of the Earth: Dinosaurs, Elephants, and God's Design

Thailand has its own fascinating dinosaur story. Scientists have discovered dinosaur fossils in several parts of the country, including the remains of huge plant-eating dinosaurs that walked the land long before humans existed. Thailand is also famous for elephants—gentle giants known for intelligence, memory, and strong family bonds.



Your challenge:

Look up one dinosaur discovered in Thailand and one fact about elephants (their size, bones, movement, or behavior). Then think carefully: Do you think elephants are related to dinosaurs—or just similar in size? Why or why not? Use evidence from what you learn to support your answer.

CELEBRATION OF LIGHT
